RULES

1. The Somerfords and District shall include the Somerfords, Brinkworth, Christian Malford, Cleverton, Corston, Dauntsey, Draycot, Grittenham, Hullavington, Kington Langley, Langley Burrell, Lea, Malmesbury, Rodbourne, Seagry, Startley, Sutton Benger
2. The Agricultural Classes are open to all.
3. Members of the Committee will attend at the Volunteer Inn at Great Somerford on the Monday before the Show between the hours of 7 pm and 8 pm to receive entries. Entries can be posted to the Secretary to arrive on the Thursday before the show.
4. Class Cards to be secured to exhibits wherever possible.
5. All produce shown must have been grown in the gardens or allotments of the exhibitors and a declaration to this effect is included in the Entry Form.
6. Any objections must be made to the Secretary before 3 pm on the day of the Show.
7. No exhibitor will be allowed to take more than one prize in any class, but can enter more than one entry in a class.
8. Exhibitors must not remove entries until after the draw, approx. 5.30 pm.
9. The decision of the Judges will be final and they will deal with matters arising from Rule 6.
10. Exhibits marked 's' must be staged in or on suitable receptacles. The Judges will pay special regard to this.
11. Prizes will be paid on SHOW DAY in the tent from 2pm.
12. Leaves of carrots, beet, turnips and parsnips must be cut off within 2 inches of the crowns.
- 13. ALL GOODS FOR EXHIBITION MUST BE BROUGHT TO THE TENT BETWEEN 8.00 a.m. - 10.00 am AFTER WHICH THE TENT WILL BE CLOSED.**

JUDGING WILL COMMENCE AT 10.30am.
